

Wrenshall City Council

July 3, 2014, 7:00 PM-Regular Meeting

Attendance: John Tanner, Melvin Martindale, Mike Hyland, Alieca Johnson, Renae House, Guy Wait, Dolores Dennie, and Susan Zmyslony.

Motion by Tanner; seconded by Martindale to approve the Agenda as presented. Motion carried.

Motion by Martindale; seconded by Tanner to approve the Consent Agenda including checks as follows: Pre-paids-#26036 - #26042....\$14,456.93; Payroll-#26043 - #26054, #26048-VOID...\$5,711.71; July bills-#26055- #26068 & 07/03/14-1 thru -3.....\$18,213.82; and Electronic Transfers- DC06/14-1 & -1 and 06/11/14-1 & 2...\$2,136.25. Motion carried.

A moment of silence was observed in remembrance of Hugh D. Line, long-time resident, former mayor and civic leader. Thank you was given to the Julie Ketchum for donating a number of Christmas lights, and city maintenance staff was recognized for their involvement in the waterline extension project and their dedication in keeping the city looking good.

Susan Zmyslony, candidate of for Carlton County Commissioner, introduced herself and spoke briefly. She will be doing house-to-house visit throughout the community in the next few weeks.

Fire Chief: There were six runs in June; 4 medical, 2 fire. Decals have been installed on the new UTV. Donations for tracks, a trailer, and accessories will be requested from the townships.

Water Operator: Tower cleaning has been scheduled and will take place July 14. Guy will get a hold of the homeowner of the residence on Goad with the broken sewer line to video and confirm what work will need to be done.

Motion by Tanner; seconded by Martindale to purchase up to two dozen flags and extra posts, and to display flags from Memorial Day through Veteran's Day each year going forward. Motion carried.

Clerk: A billing has been received from Friends of Animals (\$1,625) for animals turned in during 2013. After reviewing the list of animals and our list of approvals only three of the animals billed for were actually allowable. A letter was sent to FOA explaining our position. Filing for the offices of mayor and two council seats will open between July 29, 2014, at 8:00 AM and August 12, 2014, at 5:00 PM.

The next Planning Commission meeting will take place, Thursday, July 17, 2014, 6:30 PM.

Waterline Extension Project: The project is complete except for turf establishment and paving. One apple tree was removed during the project and will be replaced by the City. Water will

continue to be provided by the temporary line to three services along Broadway until work on the private line at the One Stop Market is complete.

Pioneer Mobile Home Park/fee for non-compliance: Inspection of the sewer line at the park shows that it is almost completely blocked with clay. The line needs to be jetted and repaired in at least three locations. A deadline of July 12, 2014, for progress on this matter was previously set. The City will keep in contact with the owner and his representative. If no progress is made the non-compliance fee of \$50/unit/month will be imposed.

Motion by Hyland; seconded by Martindale to request that the County fix potholes on Pioneer, grade/gravel Parkwood, repaint crosswalks on Broadway and fill cracks in the hall parking lot. Motion carried.

Motion by Tanner; seconded by Martindale to adjourn the meeting at 8:45 PM. Motion carried.
