

# Wrenshall City Council

## June 3, 2020, 5:30 PM-Regular Meeting

Attendance: DonnaMae Weiderman, Duane Ziebarth, Melvin Martindale, Jody Mattinen, Renae House and Alieca Johnson. Joyce Gvesrude and Jeff Goetzman took part in the meeting via Zoom. The meeting was posted on Facebook Live.

Motion by Martindale; seconded by Mattinen to approve the Agenda as presented. Motion carried.

Motion by Ziebarth; seconded by Martindale to approve the Consent Agenda including minutes from the Regular Council Meeting-May 6, 2020, and checks as follows: Pre-paids-#28980 - #28990.....\$3,974.84; Payroll #28991-#29002.....\$5,463.69; June bills #29003-#29005- VOID, 06/03/20-1 thru -3 and #29006-#29022.....\$31,351.86; and Electronic Transfers- 05/08/20-1 & - 2 .....\$2,121.86. Motion carried.

Fire Chief: There were 9 calls in May-5/medical and 4/fire. Motion by Martindale; seconded by Mattinen to approve the department's application for a DNR 50/50 grant for wildland gear in the amount of \$8,000. Motion carried. Three applications have now been received and interviews will be scheduled. Mayor Weiderman will participate in the interview process.

Thank you was given to maintenance staff for keeping the city looking good. It was also noted that the Wrenshall School did a great job with a unique graduation ceremony due to COVID-19 restrictions.

Planning Commission: Tom Cawcutt has asked the Planning Commission review the "Weapons Ordinance" and consider allowing the use of a pellet gun or a .22 with a sand shot load in city limits. Discussion was tabled for further consideration. The Park Board will meet with Luke Sydow tomorrow morning.

Engineering: The tentative start date for the Goad/Mason/Erickson project is June 15. A letter with project details will be sent to affected residents by the end of the week. TKDA is working on plans for Parkwood improvement and will be taking a topographical survey next week.

Water Operator: Monthly water sampling has been completed. Hydrant flushing will take place the week of June 22. Quotes are being received for repair of a cracked manhole on Pioneer. Three bids for cleaning of the water tower were received. Motion by Mattinen; seconded by Martindale to hire Water Tower Clean & Coat to clean the outside of the water tower at \$4,850. Motion carried

Clerk: One application was received for the maintenance position applicant pool. Motion by Mattinen; seconded by Martindale to set up an interview early next week. Motion carried. The

kick-off for summer events in the park will be Wednesday, June 10, 2020, at 7:00 PM, with an ice cream social and music provided by Tom Cawcutt.

Information on the responsibility for paving streets in the Pleasant View Addition was discussed. Past minutes and audio recordings will be reviewed for additional information.

Motion by Martindale; seconded by Mattinen to adopt Resolution 20-06 – 2020 Fee Schedule. Motion carried.
